

Set up at y^e Church Boord of each parish to be registered in the
respective parish Books there to be kept and preserved for the better
Information of those y^e shall succeed therein.

Eighthly that due Care be taken herein by all highest petty Constables
and all other officers and Magistrates that all Beggors whatsoever found
wandering or begging out of their proper parishes shall after due notice
given them as aforesaid by whipping or being put in y^e stocks two days
two nights and giving them only bread and water to be sent if possible
towards y^e parish they last lived in by y^e space of three years or to the place
where they were born and y^e such Beggors shall be enjoyned by oath to
return the next way to the sd parish of their former abode or birth
as aforesaid.

Ninthly And y^e better to prevent y^e Increase of Beggars for
the future of all Children under fifteen years of age found begging
or whose parents or friends either cannot or will not maintain
may by the Churchwardens of any parish by y^e appointment of a
Justice of peace be bound out Apprentices to any trade or to husbandry
or to any other lawful Calling Male to be bound to twenty four years, female to twenty
years or marriage or to any age y^e can be agreed for.

Tenthly y^e all putative fathers of Bastard Children unmarried women
with Child or others suspected to become parish Charges and all such as
bring them in, receive or entertain in any parish be apprehended
and brought in by y^e Constable or Churchwardens before any Justice
to be examined and bound over to y^e good behaviour committed to the
Gaole or house of Correction or otherwise dealt with according to Law
unless they give security to undampne the parish No person
be punished on these orders as and relievors of Beggars who distribute
Dole, almes, or money at a funerall only Nor the master of an hospital
or almes house who lodge or entertaine poor there according to the
Rules of their foundation only //

It was agreed by y^e minister Churchwardens and
parishioners then present that y^e number of two hundred
and forty five trees be appoynted upon y^e parishioners
to be planted by them according to a paper now in the
Churchwardens hands, Pursuant to an act of parliament
lately past in the Kingdom.
