Easter Tuesday march the 26th 1706

It was then agreed and enacted by the minister Churchwardens
& parishioners then present, that the sum of 9-4-4
be apportioned and Levied of y^e parishioners & Land-holders of y^e said
parish for uses following viz

one shilling four pence being due to Margaret Jones for washing

six shillings six pence being due to George Ramsey for mending
y^e fence of y^e Church yard, and some other ^{work} done in & about y^e Church.
3: 2: 8 for Elements for the sacrament of the Lords supper
twelve times

To George Ramsey for Ringing y^e Bell one year Ending
Easter next 1-6-0

four ~~shilling~~ shilling ^{two} pence for Articles

~~four shillings two pence~~ cutting for cutting y^e weeds in y^e
Church-yard: 2: 0

for washing y^e table Linen y^e next year one shilling eight pence
Churchwardens Expences 3-8

for Repair of y^e Church that may happen next year 2-00
And for apportioning and Collecting y^e sess, the remainder.

of Drumineully are Chosen Churchwardens to ^{serve} for y^e year Ending

George Bell of Bellinacor in stead of John Greenway to oversee
from Coondery to Kilvirgin River, Mr Robert Willson from
Killecomain to Mr Dynehill, and from y^e Blue Stone to y^e
Cagway Leading to Bellinacor mill, and from thence to the
Church gate; James Roughcastle to continue; Leonard Toulerton
from Knock-bridge to Lylo and through Kilvirgin to upper Jegg gate.
Mr Francis Mather in stead of ~~the~~ Thomas workman to oversee from
Knock-bridge to Lylo, Robert Thompson & William Bell to oversee from
from Mr Dynehill, Mr Willson's River, and from Shankill
Church to Kilvirgin River.
