Edward Murphy to succeed in the place of Alexander Ross, Mr James Turkinton in place of Patrick Hendron, James Byers to over see through Edenderry from Boimra to Northdown Bridge, and from Jennet Browns to the great Road leading through Edenderry. Mr. John Deary in place of William Waite, John Fisher & Elder in place of David Gaddis, George Dixon in place of John Bradshaw to over see from Knock Bridge to Widow Williams Hill &c.
