- (3) To make an annual subscription to Company funds of not less than 2/-.
- (4) To assist the Brigade by personal service whenever possible.

It is thought that some of our parishioners would welcome the opportunity of becoming more closely connected with the Church Lads' Brigade and in this way help in the splendid work that is being carried on amongst our boys.
